# FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

# How much does the plate cost?

The cost of the plate is \$40 in addition to annual registration fees.



# How much of the fee goes to the Illinois PGA Foundation?

The Illinois PGA Foundation receives \$25 of the \$40 when the plates are first issued. Thereafter the Foundation will receive \$38 of the \$40 fee when renewed each year.

# My plate sticker doesn't expire until the end of the year. Should I wait until then to buy the plate?

The Illinois Secretary of State Office offers a pro-rated fee for license plates that do not expire within 90 days. Please review the brochure, visit www.cyberdriveillinois.com or call (217) 782-7758 for further information.

#### Can I do a vanity plate?

Yes, Support Youth Golf license plates are available as Vanity, Personalized or Random-Number plates.

# Can I keep my same vanity tag?

The Secretary of State Vehicle Services Department makes the final decision on how plate numbers are assigned. Vanity and Personalized plates may be requested through Pick-a-Plate at www.cyberdriveillinois.com.
